
SUPPORTING FAMILY CAREGIVERS





Who are family caregivers?

A family caregiver is anyone who provides regular care for a spouse, relative, partner or friend.

The amount of care you provide may have increased over time, or you may have found yourself in that role suddenly, without notice

For many it is a labor of love, but it can also be physically and emotionally demanding.

It is important to keep a balance between caring for another individual while caring for yourself.

Family Caregivers Services

Information on local resources, support groups, in-home care, adult day services and other programs that can help make your situation easier.

Assistance in gaining access to services or completing forms.

Assessments of the caregiver's and the care recipient's situation and needs.

One on One Support and Counseling is available with a Caregiver Specialist or Long Term Support Counselor who can assist you in looking at options available to you.

Education and Training for family caregivers who feel unprepared and/or increase the skills they need in order to provide day to day care.

Family caregivers who meet eligibility requirements may be able to access, through ServiceLink, Federal or State funded supports such as:

Respite services* (such as: in-home respite care, adult day programs or short term stay in a facility)

and/o

- Other services* that may complement in caring for someone (such as: emergency response systems, assistive or adaptive equipment, home modifications, transportation services, yard work and other chore services).
- * Note: These services may be based on income or other criteria.


